design aesthetic. This lends visual unity as well as different spatial experiences, that unfold throughout the house."

As you enter the home the muted colours, clean lines and luxurious furniture announce the space to be chic and stylish. The material palette and design of the furniture and fixtures, are very inviting and promise indulgent comfort. This flavour of modish repose is seen through the home, where every space has been decorated with an accent feature with a definitive style statement. Niel reveals, "While most of the furniture is custom designed, the core idea was for each area of the home to have that one element, which would add momentary drama, in an otherwise functional space. Like the wooden pillars in the living room double as mood lighting in the night, the dressing unit in the parents' room is a collage of different materials and forms, paired with an organic shaped mirror or the playful bookshelf in the daughter's room- all these behave as sensorial elements in the space." Throughout, design elements are balanced with graceful design gestures, like the banana fibre lights suspended above the console table in the living room or the brass dressing unit whimsically offsetting the master bedroom's masculine blues. This abode has large windows that invite in ample natural light, which highlights the neutral palette of natural materials, to form sensory warmth and relaxation. ♦

Pooja tells us, "The house explores the idea of an artistic expression through geometric play of different materials coming together to form a dynamic space that's full of energy...which also reflects the home owner's personality. Most of the customised furniture is formed in brass and wood, with a graphical and minimalist
